I haven't really had time to sit down and think about what to type. What I want to write is that everything is going to be ok (which it is) and that we don't have anything to worry about because God is in control (which He is). What I would like to tell you is that you shouldn't let fear guide you in this time (which you shouldn't) and that, as the scripture says, "all things work together for the good of those who love God," (this is true). I want to say all those things which, don't get me wrong, are good things to say during this time, but these are things that you have heard many people say, many people write, many people tell you during this pandemic, and they've become talking points that we don't really listen to anymore. Again, these aren't bad things to hear or say; these aren't things that need only be said/heard once and then no more. These are great things.

Here's the thing though, we don't know how this thing is going to turn out. We know that God is in control, and that we shouldn't live in fear. There is uncertainty about how this all will pan out, when it's going to end, is it going to end, and so on, and so on... and that's ok.

It's during those thoughts and questions that I turn to Hebrews 11. In this chapter we are reminded that trust is strongest when we don't know the outcome, when our clarity is dim or non-existent. Noah built an ark while waiting 120 years for a flood. Sarah was told to trust God for a child in her old age thinking how could that ever happen. Abraham went out, "not knowing where he was going" and planned to sacrifice his own son with no clarity as to why he was called to do this or what might happen because of it. The stories go on. The truth, though, is unmistakable. Faith flourishes when we are trusting God and have a willingness to let go of our insistence for wanting to know what's going to happen, and we give up the need for clarity.

So, we don't know what is going to happen this month or the next month. We don't know how long this pandemic is going to last or if we will ever get back to normalcy. Everything is going to be ok, and God is in control. We shouldn't let fear be our guide during this time because, like the scripture says, "all things work together for the good of those who love God." We know this is true because of our faith in our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. We know this is true because His resumé is flawless, and His love is never -failing, never-ending, never-wavering, and never-fading. We know this is true because we can look back and see His faithfulness and goodness in our lives, even if we did not perceive it during our trials. He has not changed. You can trust Him now, even though there are hard times. Let's search less for clarity and more for the character of God in this unpredictable season of our life.
