Prison Promises

It is quite amazing what we learn or what we can learn in difficult and dark places. The book of Philippians was written by Paul while in the Mamertine Prison in Rome, but you get the impression while reading it that he is on some enchanted island enjoying the beautiful scenery. When you arrive at chapter four it feels as though you have entered one of the most holy places of scripture learning from one who has walked through some of the most difficult, dangerous, and deadly paths. The promises that are retrieved from this chapter need to be remembered in this present time. Let us linger a while in this deep place of hope and encouragement.

Verse five reminds us of the *"Presence of the Lord,"* "Let your gentleness be known to all men. The Lord is at hand." Paul could manage prison because the bars of prison could not hold out the presence of the Lord.

Verse six reminds us that "*Prayer is Heard*," "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God;". Paul may have been cut off from many of his friends but his connection and communication with the Lord was never disconnected.

Verse seven reminds us of the *"Peace that Guards,"* "and the peace of God, which surpasses all understand-

ing, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus. Even with the imminent threat of death facing him, Paul slept with perfect peace.

Verse ten reminds us of the *"Providence of God,"* "But I rejoiced in the Lord greatly that now at last your care for me has flourished again; though you surely did care, but you lacked opportunity." The providence of God means that He sees to it beforehand. Someone has said, "Life is not a series of accidents but a series of appointments."

Verse thirteen reminds us of the *"Power of Christ,"* "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." A Christian is adequate through Jesus for the demands of life.

Verse nineteen reminds us of the "*Provision of God*," "And my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus." The Lord's resources are not based on how the stock market or economy is doing.

Today is a good day to make the decision that you will stand on the promises of God!
