Imitators Needed

The apostle Paul makes a startling statement in I Corinthians 11:1 when he writes, "Imitate me, just as I also imitate Christ." Paul was inviting the believers in Corinth to use his life as a pattern to follow that would in turn lead them to be imitators of Christ. Paul's statement should not be taken as a sign of arrogance but a challenge to have this same pursuit of intimacy with Jesus Christ. There is an urgent need of exemplary, Christ-honoring lives that can be examined by new believers and drifting believers that will lead them down the proper path of imitating Christ for themselves. Our latest series entitled "Imitating Jesus" will seek to lead us to the same pursuit that Paul was practicing. We will examine the life and character traits of Jesus each Sunday morning and seek to align our lives with His perfect life.
