Thanks to all that served and made the Fall Festival a great evening for the families of our church and community. Your sacrifice has not gone unnoticed. The Operation Christmas Child emphasis is well on its way to reaching the goal of over 1,200 boxes this year with over 650 already packed and another packing party planned for November 5-6. "The Gospel to Every Home" outreach is going well as we are close to completing our zone responsibility. There are approximately 2,200 homes in our zone alone, and you have covered over 1,600 of these homes and will cover another 150 more. We have also helped a couple of other zones and will continue after we complete zone 7.

The staff has begun planning for Alaska Missions 2022, and we will have an informational meeting on Sunday, November 7. The dates for the trip will be June 18-25, 2022. A deposit of \$100 will secure a spot, and it is due by November 28. Our Thanksgiving Meal Ministry to our friends and neighbors across the county will take place on Thursday, November 25. You will be hearing how you can help with covering costs of turkeys, preparing food items, and delivering to the community.

Thanks to all the volunteers who have served in so many ways through the year. You have served through sacrificial giving, outreach in the community, mission trips, sports camp, teaching, nursery, cooking, calling, and many other ways. You have also been incredible in your giving this year to the general budget and to many other worthy ministries. Our biggest, and one of my favorites, is our offering for the Lottie Moon International Missions Offering that will be received throughout the month of December. Begin praying and planning now what the Lord will have you do in supporting our 4,000 missionaries.
