FROM YOUR PASTOR

"Radical Reevaluation"

These are the words that come from the pen of Richard Ross, a fifty-year veteran of working with youth and adults important to youth. Richard served for many years as a youth minister, youth ministry consultant with Lifeway Christian resources and now as a professor at Southwestern Theological Seminary. Recent studies show that fifty percent of teenagers who attended church most of their lives leave the church and that forty percent that become adult church members do not know basic beliefs and do not make a difference for the faith. He points out that only ten percent of those the church invested in for eighteen years continue to love God, love people and make disciples. He goes on to outline the following troubling results of the present model of youth ministry.

"Most churches have lost focus on evangelizing lost teenagers outside the walls of the church. If teenagers only hear and respond to the Gospel while attending the church, most of the next generation will spend their eternity in torment.

Most churches keep teenagers encased in a youth ministry silo. The present model of youth ministry may create a love for the youth group but does not create young adults who love the bride of Christ. We must give teenagers many more heart connections with the congregation and many new ways to do ministry side-by-side with the adult church.

Few churches provide intensive discipleship for those teenagers who are endeavoring to follow Jesus. We are creating young adults with little background in biblical interpretation, apologetics, core doctrines, worldview, missions, ethics and other vital disciplines that are necessary for a mature, enduring faith.

Most churches are not discipling and equipping parents to spiritually lead their teenage children. Tragically, even parents involved in the church are giving their primary loyalty to a new trinity—athletics, academics and the arts. Sunday morning worship is an option only on weekends no other activities are on the calendar." I pray that we will be a church that is unafraid of radical reevaluation when it comes to reaching the lost for Christ and discipling the saved to a growing and maturing faith.

This month we will have Wesley Hadden coming in view of a call to serve as the Family Minister among us. Details for the weekend of January 4 -5 can be found in the Youth Corner article. Please pray over this decision and plan to be here during the meet and greet time. Our search team has been diligent and prayerful through this process and highly recommend this young man to our church.

Take notes of the dates for Volleyball emphasis, Family Fun Night, Men's Day, Wednesday Family Fellowship, Van visitation and the upcoming Valentine Banquet February 9.

Let's continue to focus on "Who's Your One" throughout January by praying for your one's salvation daily and taking the opportunity to share the Gospel steps with them and giving them an opportunity to make a yes or no decision.
