### What Do You Really Deserve?

The great hymn writer, Isaac Watts, in his hymn, "Alas and Did My Savior Bleed," wrote these penetrating words in its opening stanza:

"Alas, and did my Savior bleed And did my Sovereign die? Would He devote that sacred head For such a worm as I?"

For some reason the word "worm" was replaced with the word "sinner." I realize that both words carry a meaning that doesn't bode well for humanity but doesn't the word "worm" paint a picture of our humanity at a level that is greatly needed today.

The Psalmist writes in Psalm 22 verse 6: "But I am a worm, and no man; A reproach of men and despised by the people." This chapter is considered a messianic psalm that describes so vividly the suffering of Jesus. Jesus was looked at by human beings as nothing more than a creepy, crawly, creature. A worm! No value but to be crushed under foot. But humanity had it all backwards. It is not Jesus that is the "worm," but it is all of humanity that is nothing more than a worm. Our true condition is that we are nothing and deserve nothing and the sooner we realize this and accept it the better off we will be in life.

Dr. John McArthur in a recent sermon made this statement: "Many ministers and many laypeople have lost their joy. The root cause of this loss is that they believe they deserve more than they have at that moment. Joy is always forfeited when we think we are getting less than we deserve." This means that we get in a state where we believe we are worthy of more recognition, a higher position, and a better condition than we presently enjoy. These thoughts that focus on not getting our fair share lead us to a place of lost joy. The unfair thoughts are so out of place because it is ludicrous to think we even deserve what we have presently and where we are presently. We are nothing but "worms" in the scheme of God's glorious majesty. That this incomprehensible God even takes thought of us is beyond comprehension.

So, lets reevaluate our attitude and mindset and state emphatically that we are beyond blessed to be where we are, to do what we do, and to have what we have. We are quite a blessed group of "Worms!"

This month we will enjoy a children's egg hunt on the 10<sup>th</sup>, the Easter Cantata on the 17<sup>th</sup> with coffee and donuts before, a special offering for our mission trips on the 24<sup>th</sup> and the Lord's Supper during the morning services on the 24<sup>th</sup>. As we look ahead into May be aware that the Baby Dedication will be on May 8<sup>th</sup> and Graduate Recognition Sunday will be May 15<sup>th</sup>. Vacation Bible School will be held May 30 – June 3. Please plan to volunteer for this special ministry to our children.


