EQUIPPED

"And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ, till we all come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a perfect man, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ; that we should no longer be children, tossed to and fro and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, in the cunning craftiness of deceitful plotting, but speaking the truth in love, may grow up in all things into Him who is the head-Christ- from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by what every joint supplies, according to the effective working by which every part does its share, causes growth to the body for the edifying of itself in love."


This passage in Ephesians 4:11-16 reminds of the role that pastors and teachers play in the life of the church as *equipping* agents. Note with me the first area, *Equipped to Discern:* The believer individually and believers corporately should be equipped to discern between truth and error. I John 4:1 states that we are to "test the spirits whether they are of God or not." The believers in Berea, Acts 17:10-11, were esteemed because they "searched the scriptures daily to find whether these things were true or not."

It is never wrong to examine teachings, methods, and movements that claim to be of God or claim to represent the Faith. Our standard is the written Word of God. It is wise and honorable to God to determine if things line up with His Word. This is not being judgmental or cynical but discerning. This requires examining what is said, written, and practiced. The ability to do this in a spirit of love requires equipping. There are many equipping avenues available in our local church. On Sunday mornings, Sunday evenings, and Wednesday gatherings you will find good foundational teaching. You must make the choice to place yourself under these sound teaching moments. They will develop you to discern among things espoused in the "religious" and "secular" world. These moments will benefit you regardless of your spiritual age or biological age.

Pray for your equippers and support them with your presence. Especially pray for the equippers because there is nothing more discouraging than preparing a proper meal for the family of God and few show up to the table. It is discouraging to the equippers when everything else takes precedence over the gathering around the study of truth. It is heartbreaking to the equipper to see many that are weak, sickly, and deceived spiritually when the nourishment is available to bring wholeness. It is frustrating to the equipper when folks suggest a sermon or series on a subject that had just been laboriously prepared and delivered on a Sunday or Wednesday and they were MIA. Determine to place yourself in a position where you will be equipped. Next month we will examine the second emphasis found in this passage concerning the matter of Equipped!

He is like a tree planted by water, that sends out its roots by the stream, and does not fear when heat comes, for its leaves remain green, and is not anxious in the year of drought, for it does not cease to bear fruit." Jeremiah 17:7-8

My deepest desire for our kids is that we will be planting seeds in all that we do so they will be as this tree planted by the water, strongly rooted, growing tall and always knowing who they are in Christ. The heat and the drought will inevitably come, but we as a church have a responsibility to grow up these little ones with such faith that their leaves always remain green!
