

FROM YOUR PASTOR

### EQUIPPED: Part 2

"And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ, till we all come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a perfect man, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ; that we should no longer be children, tossed to and fro and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, in the cunning craftiness of deceitful plotting, but speaking the truth in love, may grow up in all things into Him who is the head-Christ- from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by what every joint supplies, according to the effective working by which every part does its share, causes growth to the body for the edifying of itself in love."

This passage in Ephesians 4:11-16 reminds of the role that pastors and teachers play in the life of the church as *equipping* agents. Last month we observed their role as equipping to discern, this month we will observe that their role is to *equip to serve*.

A great danger of the local church is to see the pastoral staff and other teachers as nothing more than "hirelings". A hireling is a person that is employed to undertake menial work in the place of another. Though it is true that staff members do have a calling to a particular task and should be held responsible to fulfill the requirements agreed upon we must remember that the text reminds that the pastor-teacher's main work is that of equipping the members to do the work of ministry. This reveals that it is not only impossible for staff members to replace members in their responsibility but that it is completely unscriptural for that to be attempted.

The equipping work of the pastor, staff, and teachers allows each member of the local assembly to serve faithfully in Kingdom Work. It is devastating when a church develops an attitude that the "pastor" or "staff member" is paid to do the work of ministry such as witnessing, visiting, greeting, planning all activities, leading all activities, and unclogging commodes, turning off lights, and locking doors. It can be discouraging to equippers when much planning, preparation, and instruction has been given and the "team/members" don't show up for the "game". A great deal of time goes into the preparation of preaching, teaching, training, and planning for ministry. It is a joyful moment when the members show up to get their "hands dirty". When members of a church are serving and using their spiritual gifts, talents, and experience, much more is accomplished than if just a few leaders are carrying out the work. It also gives greater creativity and insight for the ministry work that is being accomplished.

Determine to place yourself under the equipping ministries of our church and as you gain discernment in your faith it will lead you to knowing and finding your place of service. Many opportunities of ministry exist that you can try out and we are always open to new ways of doing ministry as the Lord raises you up to be a ministry leader.
