CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

Happy Summer church family! I can't believe we are here. So many fun and exciting things happen in the summertime, especially Vacation Bible School. This year our VBS invites us to examine the life of Daniel. Daniel finds himself in a strange land and culture that demands he and his friends literally bow down to ideals and idols that are counter to God's commands. Daniel's friends had to make a life-or-death decision. They chose God even though they knew death might come.

In no empty threat, King Nebuchadnezzar tells Daniel's friends if they don't bow to his gods and idols he will throw them into a fiery furnace. He asks them who is the god (little "g") who will deliver them out of his hands. Their response is one of my favorite passages in scripture:

"O Nebuchadnezzar, we have no need to answer you in this matter. If this be so, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and he will deliver us out of your hand, O king. But if not, be it known to you, O king, that we will not serve your gods or worship the golden image that you have set up." Daniel 3:16-18

What faith! Of course, we know that God indeed delivered them, and King Nebuchadnezzar was in awe of their God (big "G") and reversed his commands to his people, commanding them to worship the God of these men.

What idols do we bow to? What compromises do we make? What example are we setting for our kids, families, our community? Are others in awe of our steadfast faith in the face of a culture so averse to God's urging us to be more like His Son?

Whether you find yourself immersed in the VBS Marketplace experience or not, take a little time to read the story of Daniel. Maybe it will be a refresher, maybe you haven't spent too much time in the Old Testament.
