### FROM YOUR PASTOR

#### **Identity** Crisis

During World War II, Erik H. Erikson coined a phrase that stuck: *Identity Crisis*. He used it to describe the disorientation of shell-shocked soldiers who could not remember their names. Through the years this phrase has become a useful tool to describe the struggles of youth and young adults achieving a sense of identity. The phrase also describes many professing Christians who have not found their true identity which is their identity in Christ.

I John 5:18-20 states, "We know that whoever is born of God does not practice sinning; but he who has been born of God keeps himself, and the wicked one does not touch him. We know that we are of God, and the whole world lies under the sway of the wicked one. And we know that the Son of God has come and has given us an understanding and we are *in Him* who is true, *in His Son* Jesus Christ. This is the true God and eternal life." Our identity in Christ means the very nature and life of Jesus is living inside of us. Our identity is not based on what we have done or what we are doing but on Jesus who lives in us and what He did for us. Becoming aware of our vital connection with Jesus is the key to becoming aware of who we are. When we say that Christ is our life this means that His joy, love, peace, and strength becomes our joy, love, peace, and strength.

We move into an understanding that though we are sinful, we are justified, flawed yet forgiven, and left with work to do yet secure. Our identity in Christ helps us realize that we are saints (Eph.2:19), we are blest (II Cor.9:8), we are saved (John 5:24), we are reconciled (Rom. 5:10,11), we are heard (Jer.29:12-13), we are new (II Cor.6:7), we are forgiven (Eph. 4:32), we are adopted (Rom. 8:15-17), we are loved (Rom.8:37-39), we are reward-ed (Gal.6:9), and we are victorious (I Jn.5:4).

The beginning stages of a new Christian's life should focus on reading the Scriptures, prayer, worship, and witnessing but it also must focus on this matter of understanding one's new identity is a Christ identity. This means not just focusing on things we should do as a Christian but who we are as Christians.

Mark your calendars for the following: Lord's Supper Observance at 9:00am and 11:00am on August 13. Children's Summer Nights Musical on August 27 at 6:30pm. Our Fall Revival is scheduled for September 17-20. Our preacher will be Dr. Todd Gray who serves as the Executive Director of the Kentucky Baptist Convention. The service times on Sunday, September 17, will be at 10:30am and 6:30pm and Monday – Wednesday at 7:00pm nightly. Our Sunday School during the revival will start at 9:30am on this special day.

Hope to see you here for the "Sundae" Evenings Kickoff on Sunday, August 6 at 6:30pm. Plan to bring some homemade ice cream, brownies, and cookies for the fellowship. Our staff will share a few highlights of ministry for the rest of the year and give you a sneak peak at dates and plans for next Summer. There will also be time for activities in the FLC and board game action around the table in the Fellowship Hall.
