FROM YOUR PASTOR

Times of Refreshing

"For I will pour water on the thirsty land, and streams on the dry ground; I will pour my Spirit upon your offspring, and my blessing on your descendants." Isaiah 44:3

Isaiah encourages God's covenant people with a promise of refreshing that is equated with water being poured upon dry ground that results in streams of water where the land was parched. He equates this much needed water with the Holy Spirit. It is interesting that the Holy Spirit is symbolized with water by Jesus in John 7:37-39 and in verse 38 the Scripture says, "Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them." In our passage Isaiah equates the reception and outpouring of the Holy Spirit with blessings. This is exactly what we learn in the New Testament and experience as we are saved and indwelt by the Holy Spirit. He lives within us, and this leads to an experience like the replenishing the ground receives when the rain falls on dry soil. We become the recipients of a myriad of blessings. Tragically, we have the propensity to move away from this initial newfound state of joy because we disallow the Holy Spirit to have absolute control over our lives. This always results in a grieving or quenching of Him.

Due to this potential, the child of God needs moments of refreshing that move from a state of taking control of one's own life to relinquishing control to the Holy Spirit. We have one of those moments coming up in the form of our Fall Revival. There is something about a time that is dedicated daily to gathering with the church to pray, praise, and receive the proclamation of God's Word. It can often be a time of refreshing for the child of God and even a time of experiencing the joy of the new birth found in Jesus that results in receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit who brings fruitful life to a once drying and dying life.

Revival services will start with a combined service on Sunday, September 17th at 10:30am and then again at 6:30pm. Monday -Wednesday we will gather at 7:00pm. A nursery will be provided at each service. Dr. Todd Gray, Executive Director of the KBC, will be our preacher. Plan to be here for every service possible and pray daily until the special emphasis.

There is an opportunity to serve in Panama during March. The cost will be in the range of \$1,800 which covers your flight and expenses for the mission. There may be some scholarships to offset the cost. If interested, contact Bro. Brad or Matt Greenlee. A hard deadline has been set for October 1 due to securing tickets. We are also needing volunteers to serve in our Children's Church and Wednesday Children's ministries while Kiley recovers from surgery scheduled for September 5. Our outreach on Monday evenings at 6:30pm has proven to be a blessing as we are trying to visit all our neighbors in the city limits for the second time.
