Extending the Gospel: Our Mission and Opportunity

Romans 10:14-15 reminds us of our essential role in sharing the Gospel: "How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? As it is written: 'How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!"
